Dr Sigman is an engaging, highly knowledgeable and well-travelled speaker who often appears in the media himself. He is an Associate Fellow of the British Psychological Society, a Fellow of the Society of Biology, a recipient of the Chartered Scientist award from the Science Council and Fellow of the Royal Society of Medicine. The author of numerous books and papers and a member of the Advisory Board of the *Human Givens* Journal, he has recently been invited to address the European Parliament in Brussels on the Quality of Childhood in the European Union.

Relationships: *the human givens perspective*

Throughout the ages people have looked for the rules that underpin relationships so as to better understand what is going on around them. This has included the rules governing relationships between people and things, the mind and body (consciousness and matter), as well as between couples, children, friends and colleagues. As we are social creatures, it is human affiliations that interest most people the most. But, thousands of years ago, searching for meaning through relationships also produced primitive nature worship, magical thinking, trade, arts and crafts, and eventually religion, philosophy and science. And now it is widely appreciated that nothing exists in itself or by itself, for the world is a vast tapestry woven of relations. Not even the smallest strand in this web can be tugged without affecting all the myriad other strands and interdependencies to which it is connected and of which it is composed.

Of particular interest to HGI members is the observation that the disciplines of psychotherapy, counselling, education and coaching, when they are effective, are always based on a truly holistic understanding of relationships between the biological, psychological and social aspects of human functioning. Any act or experience that has a formative effect on the mind, character or physical ability of an individual always involves developing an appreciation of deeper connections. Reading context does too, and all pattern-matching to memories, stories and metaphors are about relationships.

The 2010 HG Conference will cover this theme from a number of angles since it is relationships that make us who we are. We hope you will join us and participate in what promises to be another enjoyable, thought-provoking and richly-rewarding weekend.
