### Registered Member

Registered members of the Human Givens Institute (HGI) are HG.Dip. graduates who have passed the Post Graduate Practitioner's Assessment (Part III) of the Human Givens Diploma Course and are therefore, by having demonstrated their practical competence, fully qualified to practise as human givens therapist or counsellors and appear on the HGI's Professional Register\*.

All Registered Members are required to:

- uphold HGI ethical standards
- adhere to the HGI professional conduct policy
- undertake appropriate professional supervision
- undertake annual Continuous Professional Development (CPD)
- hold appropriate professional indemnity insurance.

### Graduate Member (GHGI)

This grade of membership is open to anyone who has completed and passed Parts I and II of the Human Givens Diploma Course, having demonstrated good theoretical understanding of the human givens approach. Most Graduate Members will be working towards full qualification and registration with the Human Givens Institute.

*Please note: Where this is the case, they must make their status as 'HG Trainee Therapist or Counsellor' clear to potential clients.*
